## From the Pastor's Desk

It's Fall! Oh, I have been awaiting this time of year. I have two favorite seasons: Fall and Spring. Fall reminds us that the whole of God's creation is about to be refreshed. Spring reminds us that the whole of creation is being refreshed. Fall is like the rest we all need; Spring is the time of awakening. Both of these seasons also create a beautiful palate of colors that shows us God's masterpiece, God's art, God's creation.

As we move into Fall, we prepare to enter into times that are full of opportunities for outreach and service. We find that we can reach out in inventive ways and share the love of God with others through unique ways. We enter into the community more intently, seeking to connect others with Christ.

As we begin to slow down during the Fall months, I issue you a challenge. But first let me say this...

Through much prayer, reading of the scripture, and silence with God, I have been asking God to speak to me regarding how we enter into the world and invite others to a relationship with Christ. We have to do as Jesus said in Matthew 28:16-20, "16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshipped him, but some doubted. 18 Jesus came near and spoke to them, "I've received all authority in heaven and on earth. 19 Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to obey everything that I've commanded you. Look, I myself will be with you every day until the end of this present age."

We, clergy and laity together, need to be doing our parts as Christ put it here. I want to share this same passage with you from The Message, which is a transliteration of the Bible, not an actual translation. In this very modern language, it reads in this manner, 16-17 Meanwhile, the eleven disciples were on their way to Galilee, headed for the mountain Jesus had set for their reunion. The moment they saw him they worshiped him. Some, though, held back, not sure about worship, about risking themselves totally. 18-20 Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age."

Here is the challenge. Over this next month, invite at least one person to come to worship with you. Don't just invite them to worship, offer to pick them up and take them out to eat. Something similar was said during our meeting on September 27. It was an echo of what I have been suggesting for years. The second part of the challenge is to invite people to come to any of our community wide events: breakfast, lunch, Trunk or Treat, etc. The third part of the challenge is to attend Sunday School, either or both of our Bible studies, Wednesday Night Connection, or any other offering of Spiritual renewal and educational opportunities we may offer. Then finally, the last part of the challenge is to remember that you are needed, even when we do not say anything. The staff, with a handful of volunteers, here at the church have spent a year and a half trying to keep everything together in the midst of trying times. We are weary. We are exhausted. We need you all to help us as much as you can. If you are able to help make any of the needed phone calls to check on people, other than those who are sick or in the hospital, we can use you. If you want to help make a difference in our community by making disciples who make disciples, then come back to worship, activities and studies to help grow and revive your faith, then share the love and grace of Christ with others. If you want to help feed the hungry, then volunteer for a food ministry team. If you think you can't do anything at all, you can: pray. We need the prayers also. Let us prepare for renewal and rebirth. Let Fall be the time we are working toward renewal and rebirth, making way for blossoming in Spring. May we all live the words of Jesus Christ and the challenge to go and do. Grace and Peace...Pastor Angie

#### COVID WORSHIP UPDATES

The Administrative board has voted to lift ALL COVID restrictions previously imposed concerning worship.

The decision was made based on the following:

1. We have reached a point that a vast majority of our people are going out to eat, going to the grocery stores, etc. where masks and distancing are not required.
  2. If someone wishes to wear masks at their own discretion, vaccinated or unvaccinated they are encouraged to do so.
  3. We need to return to "normal."
  4. We will continue with the online option for worship for those who aren't comfortable being in person with others.
  5. We are suffering due to lack of human contact with others. Jesus was all about building relationships. We are not able to do this with the restrictions.
  6. When combining the statistics from the two counties together, we have been safe for weeks.
  7. Vaccinations continue to increase as well as the natural immunity levels of those who previously had COVID.
